**2007 Scholarship Opportunities for Women**

The Center for American Archeology, Kampsville, Illinois is pleased to offer a limited number of merit-based scholarships for women students wishing to enroll in either the **High School Field School Program** or the **Adult Field School Program**. These scholarships are made possible through a generous grant made by the **Monticello College Foundation** in Godfrey, Illinois, a former women's college. Potential applicants should read the following list of requirements carefully. On average, scholarship awards cover 50% of program tuition. Awards are determined by review of the Statement of Interest, teacher recommendations (as appropriate for program), and the length of the program in which the applicant wishes to enroll (number of weeks). Scholarship money will help to subsidize CAA program tuition; scholarship recipients are responsible for remaining tuition balance (as appropriate), travel expenses, and personal spending money.

***Application review will begin Monday, April 23, 2007. Awards will be made on a first-come, first-served basis, and will continue until grant funds are expended.***

**High School Field School** (June 25-July 13, 2007): Students ages 14-17 interested in applying for a scholarship must submit a brief (1-2 pages) Statement of Interest, in which they describe their interest in archeology, future education and career plans, and why participation in the CAA's High School Field School will help them achieve their goals. Applicants should also indicate whether they are interested in enrolling in 1, 2, or 3 weeks of the program. The Statement of Interest should be sent in with the applicant's Registration Form and two Teacher Recommendations (see "Registration Packet" on the main page of the website).

**Adult Field School** (July 9-August 3, 2007): Women 18 and older, who are currently enrolled in college or graduate school and who are majoring, or planning to major, in archeology, anthropology, or a related field (e.g., cultural studies, museum studies, geography, etc.) are eligible to apply for scholarship support. Rising freshmen or recent college graduates who will be enrolling in a graduate program in the next academic year are also eligible. Interested applicants should prepare a brief Statement of Interest (1-2 pages) that describes the applicant's interest in archeology, future education and career plans, and why the Adult Field School program will be of potential benefit in meeting these goals. Applicants should also indicate whether they are interested in enrolling for 1, 2, 3, or 4 weeks. The Statement of Interest should be submitted with a completed Registration Form.
